




Bi- Annual Distribution Report




Overview:

The second half of 2016 has seen continued growth in the ECD's we support directly as part of our ECD Connect Programme. We have now reached our target of over 200 crèches in Gauteng which we engage with on a monthly basis. There is also a big drive to increase the ECD's in our programme in the Western Cape. Thanks to our partnership with PMB Community Chest and other Durban based donors, we were also able to increase the number of children we feed in the KwaZulu Natal area.


We are currently in talks with various organisations to increase the number of partnerships we have, which will not only assist us in packing more meals, but assist us in reaching more beneficiaries.

This year Stop Hunger Now will open a new branch in the Eastern Cape. The branch, which will be situated in East London will be opened before July 2017.

A highlight of the second half of 2016 was that we were able to exit 15 ECD's in the Gauteng area. This essentially means that due to our assistance over the years and the savings which was created by receiving SHN SA meals they were able to improve their facilities to meet the standards required by the Department of Social Development. These facilities are now officially registered and will start receiving a government grant.


Areas of Focus

Each box received by one of the crèches on the ECD Connect programme creates a saving of between R100 to R150. Each ECD is then encouraged to spend the savings on the 5 main focus areas (planned Outcomes). M&E is conducted on each delivery to ensure the money saved is being spent wisely.

- **Planned Outcomes**
 1. Safety equipment
 2. Sanitation infrastructure
 3. Nutrition infrastructure
 4. Improved learning environment
 5. Teacher training

Partnership Breakdown

We would like to take this opportunity to thank our partners during the 2016/17 year for assisting us in distributing meals to nearly 38 000 beneficiaries.



We have once again seen a major increase in the demand for meal assistance at tertiary education institutions. We are currently in negotiations with some of our major donors to assist us in sponsoring meal packing events at various universities to help alleviate the problem. We also believe that by engaging with the students to participate at university meal packing events it will not only help generate awareness about the situation but sensitize students to the problem. This will hopefully remove some of the stigmatization attached to not having food and allow more students to come forward for help.

Conclusion.

Thanks to our partners, donors and volunteers, Stop hunger Now SA was able to distribute over 4 000 000 meals during the 2016/17 financial year. Big plans and targets have been laid down for 2017 and we are confident that we will not only be able to feed more people in need, but reach further out and assist more areas of need around Southern Africa.
